



Based on the number of parents who sent me their GL raw scores and information, we can tell that a raw score of around 74%-75% secured an *A grade* last year.


- It's hard to be exact as we would've needed full data, but this is a fair estimate based on the detailed results submitted.
- Each year can be different as grades are based on standardised scores.
- This shows (hopefully), you have room for error and don't need to secure 100% to get an A.




# **Tips To Help Your Child**


- 1. Use a notebook When your child does a test, sit down and go over the test with them, identifying if the mistakes are 'silly' mistakes or gaps in knowledge.
- 2. Record any questions that they did not know- that were gaps in knowledge.
- 3. Count up the 'silly' mistakes as this will help the child see the additional marks they could have got and encourage them to avoid these in future, e.g. tick 2 boxes.
- 4. These notes will help you and your child know the areas that are 'gaps in knowledge' and which are recurring 'silly' mistakes which should be avoided.
- 5. As class teachers, we are looking over the tests and finding common 'areas of learning' that need to be revisited and revised with the children.



## **Mathematics**



- It is important that your child has quick recall of the basic table facts. These should be learned thoroughly, and we will ask pupils to revise table facts each week to consolidate their knowledge and understanding. Please take 5-10 minutes per night to ask your child questions on their weekly revision booklet.
- We are working to readdress topics covered in Primary 6 prior to the transfer. After this time, we will be revisiting some of the topics more thoroughly as the children will sit assessments in both Literacy and Numeracy in May.



This is an important aspect of your child's development and with your support we hope to foster a love for reading.

This will benefit the child's written work, spelling and general fluency.

Please discuss what they have read, ask questions as this will have encourage them in the reading process.

We are continuing to work towards children preparing their reading at home, then returning to school ready to discuss the text.

# Spellings /

We will continue to work from the Spelling for Literacy scheme (for the majority of pupils).

Some pupils may need reinforcement of spelling rules, patterns and sounds and will work through the SNIP Literacy Spelling Scheme.

The children will prepare spellings as follows;

Monday – 1-8 words and spelling activity page

Tuesday – 9-16 words

Wednesday – Additional words (SEAG related & key words)


Thursday – Revise (copy all spellings 3 times)

We will have daily spelling practice in school to assess spelling retention.

Spelling booklets should be returned to school every day.

Corrections are completed 3 times or 10 times on a Friday test.

- All pupils will have spellings, reading, table facts along with a longer written activity.
- We encourage your child to complete their homework as early as possible and, in a space, free from distraction.
- As a rule of thumb, we would ask that your child takes no more than 30-minutes completing written homework. All work reflects class teaching, if your child is struggling with something don't let this become a repetitive source of frustration at home. Please let us know.

- We would ask that you contact the school office if you require to pass a message on or send a written note.

- ...so that you are aware of your child's learning and progression.
- We will carry out Homework Diary check-ups to ensure children are recording their homework the correct way.

# **Punctuality**

• The register opens at 8:45am, time is vital and so we wish to begin formal activities no later than 8:55am. Your child will complete morning starter activities during this time.

• The class teacher will be waiting in their room at 8:45am to welcome the children.

 Children should not enter the building prior to 8:45am due to safety and supervision reasons.

### **Break & Dinners**



- As a healthy eating school, we hope that you will send your child to school with a healthy snack. This should be a piece of fruit or sandwich or plain biscuit.


